# Dumping and Subsidizing

**O**RDER

Inquiry No. NQ-2008-003

**Aluminum Extrusions** 

Order issued Thursday, December 18, 2008



IN THE MATTER of an inquiry, pursuant to section 42 of the *Special Import Measures Act*, respecting aluminum extrusions produced via an extrusion process, of alloys having metallic elements falling within the alloy designations published by The Aluminum Association commencing with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7 (or proprietary or other certifying body equivalents), with the finish being as extruded (mill), mechanical, anodized or painted or otherwise coated, whether or not worked, having a wall thickness greater than 0.5 mm, with a maximum weight per metre of 22 kg and a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of 254 mm, originating in or exported from the People's Republic of China.

### **ORDER**

WHEREAS the Canadian International Trade Tribunal (the Tribunal) is required, pursuant to section 42 of the *Special Import Measures Act*, to make inquiry as to whether the dumping and subsidizing of the aforementioned goods have caused injury or retardation or are threatening to cause injury to the domestic industry;

AND WHEREAS, based upon information available to the Tribunal, it appears that Daymond Aluminum (Daymond) is a producer of the goods that are the subject of the Tribunal's inquiry;

AND WHEREAS Daymond is refusing to provide information requested by the Tribunal in its questionnaire request;

AND WHEREAS the Tribunal considers such information to be relevant and important to the conduct of its inquiry;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to subsection 17(2) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act*, the Tribunal has, as regards the production and inspection of documents, the enforcement of its orders and other matters necessary or proper for the due exercise of its jurisdiction, all such powers, rights and privileges as are vested in a superior court of record;

UPON the Tribunal's own motion;

AND UPON being satisfied that Daymond has or is likely to have information in its possession or control relevant to the Tribunal's inquiry;

### THE TRIBUNAL ORDERS THAT:

- 1. A duly authorized representative of Daymond shall make and deliver to the Tribunal a written return of information under oath or solemn affirmation in fulfilment of the information requirements listed in the attached schedule.
- 2. Unless Daymond attends before the Tribunal **before December 30, 2008**, and satisfies the Tribunal that this order should not have been issued or that the required information cannot reasonably be provided, the required information is to be received no later than close of business (5:00 p.m. Eastern Time) **on January 5, 2009**, at the office of the Secretary of the Tribunal at the following address:
