# Dumping and Subsidizing

## DECISION

Request for the initiation of a public  
interest inquiry  
PB-2024-001

Certain Wire Rod

*Decision and reasons issued  
Thursday, April 3, 2025*

IN THE MATTER OF representations as to whether there are reasonable grounds to consider that the imposition, in whole or in part, of an anti-dumping duty on imports of certain hot-rolled wire rod of carbon steel and alloy steel of circular or approximately circular cross section, in coils, equal to or less than 25.5 mm in actual solid cross-sectional diameter, originating in or exported from the People's Republic of China, the Arab Republic of Egypt and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, as a result of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's finding dated October 4, 2024, in inquiry NQ-2024-001 conducted pursuant to section 42 of the *Special Import Measures Act* (SIMA), would not or might not be in the public interest pursuant to section 45 of SIMA.

### DECISION

Pursuant to section 45 of SIMA, the Tribunal is of the opinion that there are no reasonable grounds to consider that the imposition of an anti-dumping duty, or the imposition of such a duty in the full amount provided for by SIMA, in respect of the goods referred to in the Tribunal's finding in inquiry NQ-2024-001 would not or might not be in the public interest. Accordingly, the Tribunal will not initiate a public interest inquiry into this matter.
