WHEREAS the above-mentioned complaint was filed on September 25, 2014, on behalf of Mr. G. Rondeau;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian International Trade Tribunal decided, on October 2, 2014, to inquire into the complaint, pursuant to subsection 30.13(1) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act* and subsection 7(1) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Procurement Inquiry Regulations*;

AND WHEREAS, on October 22, 2014, Mr. G. Rondeau filed a request to withdraw the complaint, because, according to the information related to the Canadian International Trade Tribunal, the Department of Public Works and Government Services has decided to re-evaluate his proposal;

AND WHEREAS subsection 30.13(5) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act* provides that, if it is of the opinion that the complaint is trivial, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal may cease conducting the inquiry;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian International Trade Tribunal is of the opinion, for these reasons, that the complaint is therefore trivial and that it deems it appropriate, in the present case, to cease the inquiry;
