ORDER

In its determination of March 12, 2010, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal, pursuant to section 30.16 of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act*, awarded the Department of Public Works and Government Services its reasonable costs incurred in responding to the complaint. The Canadian International Trade Tribunal's preliminary indication of the level of complexity for the complaint case was Level 3, and its preliminary indication of the amount of the cost award was \$3,000.
