**ORDER**

In its determination of October 25, 2013, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal, pursuant to section 30.16 of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act*, awarded the Department of Public Works and Government Services its reasonable costs incurred in responding to the complaints. The Canadian International Trade Tribunal's preliminary indication of the level of complexity for the complaint case was between Level 1 and Level 2, and its preliminary indication of the amount of the cost award was \$1,500. Of this, \$500 is to be paid by Raymond Chabot Grant Thornton Consulting Inc. and \$1,000 is to be paid by PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, as the complaint brought by PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP was of increased complexity due to the motion that it brought. Noting that there have been no submissions contesting the preliminary indication of the level of complexity or the preliminary indication of the amount of the cost award, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal hereby confirms its preliminary indications by awarding the Department of Public Works and Government Services its costs in the amount of \$1,500 for responding to the complaints, and directs Raymond Chabot Grant Thornton Consulting Inc. and PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP to take appropriate action to ensure prompt payment.
