**ORDER**

WHEREAS the above-mentioned complaint was filed on June 23, 2020, by Johnson Controls Canada LP;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian International Trade Tribunal decided, on June 30, 2020, to inquire into the complaint, pursuant to subsection 30.13(1) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act* and subsection 7(1) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Procurement Inquiry Regulations*;

AND WHEREAS on September 2, 2020, Johnson Controls Canada LP withdrew the complaint;

AND WHEREAS on September 2, 2020, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police agreed not to seek costs;

AND WHEREAS on September 2, 2020, the intervenor, Black & McDonald, agreed not to seek costs;

AND WHEREAS subsection 30.13(5) of the *Canadian International Trade Tribunal Act* provides that the Canadian International Trade Tribunal may cease conducting the inquiry;
